SESSION 1 - CREATE

- 1) A VALUES STATEMENT
- 2) YOUR OWN IN-HOUSE & ONLINE DRAFT CODE OF CONDUCT.

I. Values

CRAFT A VALUES SET

If Values are basic and fundamental beliefs that guide or motivate attitudes or actions. Then as a club, we can put some terms down that reflect our values.

Ask the group:

- 1. What does 'our club' value?
- 2. Do our values support all our members in being an active part of our esports club?

In a club with diverse expertise levels, identities, and interests etc., the values will extend beyond traditional 'pro sports' & esports (high performance) community values



Smash Sisters (community) team values = inclusive, accessible, kind (but accountable), & collaborative.



Matildas (high performance) team values = teamwork, discipline, resilience & leadership.

2. Code of Conduct

DRAFT AN IN-HOUSE & ONLINE CODE OF CONDUCT.

- 1) WARM UP: Students bring in examples or talk about the 'emotional tone' and 'rule-sets' from the game they play, a community they compete with (even sports!), or from a Twitch live streamer they follow.
- **AND HARMONISE:** Get groups to talk about what examples align to <u>your</u> <u>internally produced</u> esports club *Values*. What resonates & which social and written rules might align with your *Values* (with some adjustment)?
- TOGETHER: Discuss what rules & guidelines are necessary to create esports togetherness in your esports space and why. Discuss how different games, communities, or online/offline spaces create different challenges? How can you collectively address these in your Code of Conduct & Values statement?
- 4) THEN CREATE: In smaller groups, create some key guidelines to consider in your own local *Code of Conduct* for your esports club, writing rules that support the *Values* that you are encouraging.
- **AND REVISE:** Review each statement, asking: *Does this align with our values statement? & Will this affect members of various groups differently/fairly (gender, ethnicity, geography, orientation, etc)?*
- **YOUR CODE of CONDUCT:** After making small group statements join up & make a one-pager TOGETHER as a draft *Code of Conduct* for their esports club!

'emotional tone' = everyday norms & opinion-maker 'tone' of a community (think Twitch chat or a sports coach)

'rule-sets' = written guidelines, school rules, game pricing, house rules, automated and consequential rules on a game/platform (e.g. auto-bans, moderator bans, terms & conditions — TOCs, End-User-Licence Agreements - EULAs, etc.)

3. Pledge CONSIDER A PLEDGE

You've got a draft values statement and a draft pledge – hoorah!

Too difficult?

Lean into a ready-made 'pledge'




Access, Visibility, Attainable & Inspirational

Either way, make your code of conduct/pledge easy to engage with!

Make it brief, accessible, visible, attainable & inspirational.

- Can you posterise it?
- Can you embed it? (chat prompts automated; Twitch chat emotes/badges)



4. A motto!

Develop a motto – a phrase that sums up your healthy esports space 'vibe'

AnyKey uses "Keep it comfy"

A motto must be backed up by the pledge/code of conduct/rules to underpin the tone.

And, a motto can help to energise bystander leadership...

5. Bystander leadership

Led by Emeritus Professor Helen Cahill, this new study found that Year 9 boys were less confident than Year 7 boys about whether to intervene in cases of sexual harassment, with the intention to intervene falling from 20.2% to 12.8%. Overall girls and gender diverse young people were more likely to say they would intervene than boys.

Step 1 is greater awareness. Step 2 is more people taking action. That might create an increase in the number of incidents that are reported. Long term we'd like to think that these issues are dealt with locally and that it improves the culture at club level where people participate.

Rock, paper, scissors, run! Or Hand slap. In 10person(ish) groups: 1. Draft a healthy values set for your 'club' – what you want your club to 'be' (4-6 terms) 2. Play (carefully!) Or don't – you are all entering 'the arena' with preconceived ideas of what this will be! 3. Ask: did the play align with your values set? Let's PLA 4. From here, adjust your values set and—instead of a code of conduct—create a basic tournament ruleset that nurtures your values (a one-hour tournament). 5. Test out your rules & adjust as you 'play them in'. 6. Revise your Values set – How healthy is it for existing but also emerging participants? Do final revisions to the code of conduct & consider a motto!
